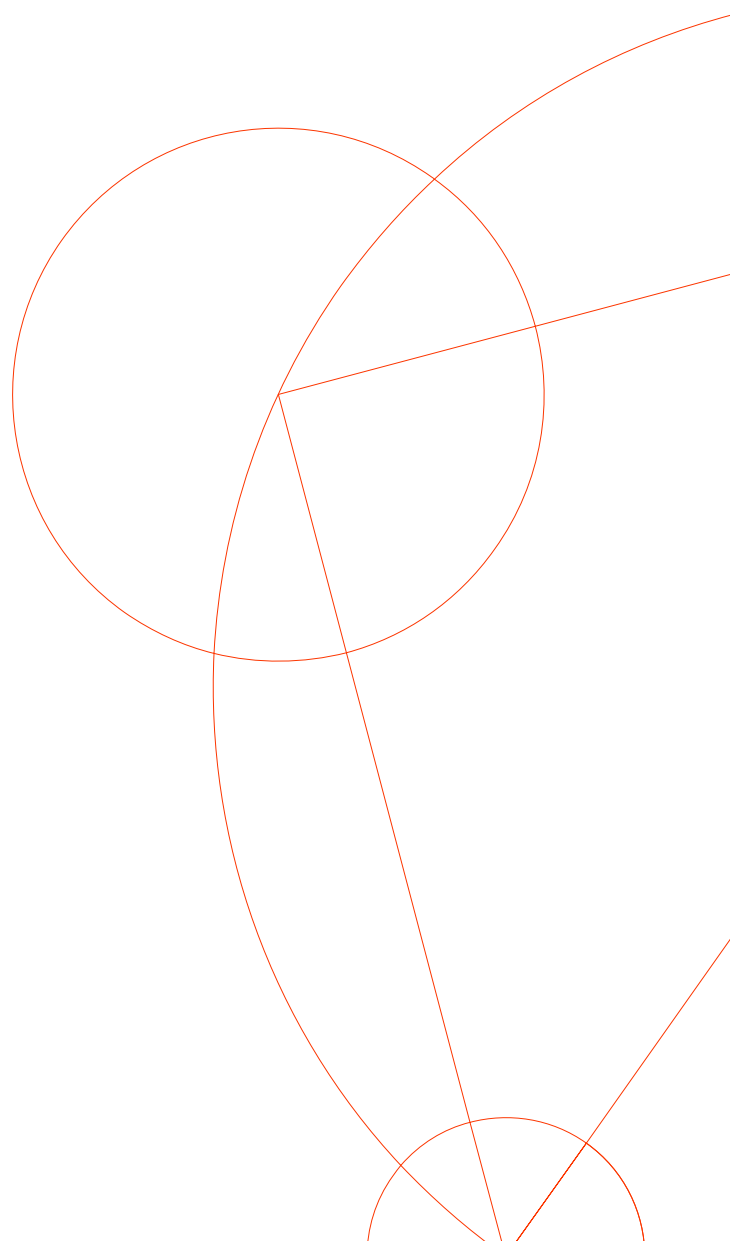

## Welcome to the PhD course catalogue 2012

The Copenhagen Graduate School of Social Sciences is happy to announce its course package for 2012. The courses are announced once a year such that students, supervisors and heads of programme may plan ahead. Courses have been selected by the Faculty's PhD Committee, which consists of representatives from academic staff and PhD students from the Faculty's five PhD programmes.

Some of the courses in the 2012 course package are held twice a year: the introductory course which is mandatory for all new PhD students, a course in Scientific Writing in English and a course in teaching pedagogy. Other courses are held once a year: research ethics (held in collaboration with the graduate schools of Humanities and Law), "Styr på tiden – personlig effektivitet" and "Forskningsformidling".

Please also note that some courses are held in English and some in Danish.

## Introductory course for new PhD students

During this 1-day course you will be introduced to your new professional life as a PhD student, the initial planning of the individual study programme, the organisational framework of the PhD programme as well as your most important rights and duties. You will also receive good advice about the planning of your studies.

This spring course is mandatory for PhD students who have enrolled as PhD students during the spring of 2012. It is also mandatory for PhD students who have begun their studies since September of 2011, but not yet attended the course. Furthermore the course is open to PhD students who have begun their studies prior to 1 September 2011.

The autumn course is mandatory for PhD students who have enrolled as PhD students during the fall of 2012. It is also mandatory for PhD students who have begun their studies since February of 2012, but not yet attended the course. Furthermore the course is open to PhD students who have begun their studies prior to 1 February 2012.

## Project Leadership (in preparation)

Being a PhD student requires project management, financial insight and leadership skills. This course will enable you to take ownership of your project and place it in relationship to the University as a whole. The course will elaborate on the leadership topic; include lectures on leadership styles, practical project management plus university finance systems and governance structures. *Project Leadership* includes practical exercises on day-to-day project management issues, feedback and instruction methods, and includes individual/group work on the participants own projects. The participants will have to give an oral presentation on a leadership/management issue at a seminar approx. 2 weeks after attending this course. The course includes the 2-day workshop Project Management for PhD students.

# Research Writing in English for PhD Students at the Faculty of Social Sciences

***A six-week course for PhD students who wish to communicate their research more effectively in English.***

## **Target Group**

The course is intended for PhD students whose first language is not English.

## **Objective**

The aim of the course is to help PhD students with composing their dissertations or research articles in English by expanding their linguistic and strategic repertoire for writing in English.

## **Content**

The course will help participants to express their ideas, arguments and findings more clearly and effectively. Participants will learn useful academic phrases, revisit essential grammar issues, and refine their understanding of sentence patterns as well as punctuation. They will also practice summarizing, defining, providing evidence and problematizing – writing strategies typical of both PhD dissertations and research articles. Additionally, the characteristics of distinctive sections of both PhD dissertations and research articles (Literature Review, Methods, Results and Conclusion) will be discussed.

Before the course starts, participants will be asked to send one sample of their writing (up to 5 pages of unedited text) so that the instructor can adjust the course content to the individual needs of its participants. During the course, participants will write a couple of paragraphs after each session to further practise. The instructor will read these short texts before the following section to offer feedback.

## **Session 3: Providing Evidence / Results and Findings**

- Ordering for emphasis
- Commenting on data
- Evaluating and recommending

### Formål

### Program

- **Proaktiv vs. Reaktiv – arbejder du på forkant eller bagkant?**

Proaktiv adfærd lykkes når vi i håndteringen af de daglige opgave er gode til at bruge:

- forstillingsevnen (hvilke "uforudste" opgaver kunne risikere at dukke op i dag?)
- samvittigheden (kan jeg tillade mig at sige nej?).

- **Prioritering**

Proaktiv adfærd kræver bevidst prioritering. Følgende to værktøjer præsenteres og diskuteres:

- Tag de store sten først – og reducer dine overspringshandlinger
- Tidsmatrix – hvad er vigtigst og hvad haster?

- **Planlægning**

Planlægning er en kreativ og fleksibel proces. Følgende værktøjer præsenteres og diskuteres:

- Gant kort
- Nedbrydningsmodellen

- **Produktivitet vs. effektivitet**

Der tales meget om effektivitet, effektive arbejdsgange, effektive samarbejdsprocesser mv. Men hvad er effektivitet egentlig? Og hvad er forskellen på at være produktiv og at være effektiv?

- **Motivation og koncentration**

Effektivitet kræver både energi og fokus. I et arbejdsliv med mange forstyrrelser kan det være vanskeligt. Deltagerne præsenteres for en række konkrete teknikker til at støtte motivationen og styrke koncentrationen.

- **Tids-styring/tids-registrering**

At få styr rigtig på tiden kræver et helt konkret overblik over hvad vi egentlig bruger tiden til. Deltagerne præsenteres for et simpelt værktøj til tids-registrering.

- **Kend dine tidsrøvere og kom dem til livs**
  - Rod og fysisk arbejdsorganisering
  - E-mails
  - Møder

## Science and Law

### Taking Your Role as a Researcher Seriously

While ethics has often been considered an issue for researchers in Medicine and Science, research ethics also pertains to the Humanities, Social Sciences and Law.

The aim of this course is to introduce PhD students from the Humanities, Social Sciences and Law to a range of basic concepts, principles and norms, which in turn will enable them to understand and reflect upon ethical questions and requirements pertaining to their research.

The course consists of four modules described more fully below and in the detailed course description which you will find in the following link: [http://samf.ku.dk/phd-skolen/pdf/ethical\\_aspects.pdf](http://samf.ku.dk/phd-skolen/pdf/ethical_aspects.pdf)

The first module focuses on basic issues of academic inquiry in terms of truth, relevance and academic freedom. The second module focuses upon moral norms involved in qualitative research, while the third module focuses upon questions of plagiarism. In the fourth module, the various themes of the course are discussed and brought to bear on the participants' own research projects.

# Undervisningspædagogik for ph.d.-studerende

## Udbydes i januar og august

Ph.d.-skolen tilbyder i samarbejde med Pædagogisk Center Samfundsvidenskab et introduktionskursus i anvendt pædagogik. Kurset henvender sig udelukkende til *Ph.d.-studerende*, der har undervisningsopgaver i 2012.

## Tid og sted

Kurset afholdes den 19. og 20. januar 2012 kl. 9.15 – 16.00 og følges af et kollegasupervisionsforløb, som igangsættes i slutningen af februar. Kurset udbydes også i efteråret, i uge 33, men datoerne ligger endnu ikke fast. Datoerne vil blive oplyst senere af Pædagogisk Center ved tilmeldingen til efterårskurset, som i øvrigt sker på samme måde som ved forårskurset. Lokale oplyses for begge kurserne ved tilmeldingsfristens udløb.

## Indhold

De to kursusdage skal give deltagerne konkrete redskaber, fif og gode råd til at planlægge og gennemføre holdundervisning. Gennem øvelser, eksempler og diskussion vil vi komme ind på spørgsmål som for eksempel:

- Hvad kræves der af en god underviser?
- Hvordan definerer og opfylder du formålet med din undervisning?
- Hvordan planlægger du semestret?
- Hvordan forskningsbaserer du din undervisning?
- Hvilke virkemidler har du til rådighed?
- Hvordan skaber du en levende dialog i klassen?

Som en del af kurset prøvekører alle deltagerne 10 minutters undervisning, som er forberedt hjemmefra. Det kan f.eks. være en introduktion til en teori eller model eller motivationen for et emne. Det vigtigste er, at oplægsholderne har planlagt deres oplægs *form*, herunder gerne med kreative forslag til at aktivere tilhørerne. Oplæggene følges op med konstruktiv respons fra underviser og de øvrige deltagere på holdet.
